

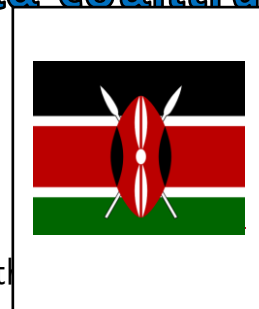
Homework Project

Would you prefer to live in a hot or a cold country?

Year 1/2 have been enjoying their Geography work around 'Would you prefer to live in a hot or a cold country?' To further support this we are setting a homework project.



Tasks for Homework – Children are required to choose and complete at least 4 of the tasks listed below. We ask that they choose at least one task from every column to cover a range of skills. They may choose to complete more than 4 tasks if they choose but 4 is the minimum expected amount.

Reading and Writing	Fact Finding / Research	Other (Craft, Maths, computer tasks etc.)
Write a diary entry about a day with the Masai tribe in Kenya. What makes a day in their life different to our days? Draw and label 2 animals, one you might find in a hot country and one you would find in a cold country. Visit the local library, do they have an atlas that you can look at? Can you find all seven continents? Write a story about travelling around the world. What might you see on the different continents you visit?	Imagine you have won a trip to Kenya. Research the types of things you might be able to do or see while you are there and plan your dream holiday. Create your own safari park. What type of animals might you have? What type of environment do they need? Research an animal you might find in the North or South Pole. What do they have that helps them to survive? Make a travel poster about a country in Asia. What could people see if they visit?	Create your own piece of African music using things you can find around the house. Ask your adult to film it and send it to the Year 1 or 2 email address. Draw a map of the world, label each of the seven continents. Record a weather report. Ask your adult to film it and send it in to the Year 1 or 2 email address.
