

Homework Project

Year 3 and 4 have got off to a great start in their Geography topic work around “Where does our food come from?”, Art looking at “Light and Dark” and investigating “States of Matter” in Science. To further support this learning, we are setting some homework activities to be completed by the above date.

Tasks for Homework – Children are required to choose and complete at least 5 of the tasks listed below. We ask that they choose at least one task from every column to cover a range of skills. They may choose to complete more than 5 tasks, but 5 is the minimum expected amount.

Reading and Writing Fact finding/ research		Other (Craft, Maths, computer tasks etc.)
Research a wild animal you would find in the garden and write a fact file about it. Remember to include the features of non-fiction writing!	Create a safety guide or poster which tells people how to make their garden animal friendly. Think about what garden visitors there might be, how they access the garden and why they come.	Create something that will help the wild animals live and thrive in a garden environment. For example; a bird feeder, or an insect hotel. You could include a drawing of your plan or design, and take photos of you making it as well as the finished product.
Write a poem about a favourite wild animal. Include description about what it sounds like, what it looks like and how it moves.	Imagine you are a cocoa bean. Write a diary entry about where you were grown, how and where you have travelled and what you have become.	Draw a detailed picture of your garden or an outside space. Don't forget to use light and dark shading to create a 3D image. You could even paint it using one of the techniques we've learnt at school.
Create a meal that has the least environmental impact. You could even make it and take a photo to send into school ... we would love to see your creations!	Research and complete an experiment where you change a material from one state of matter to another. Is the change permanent or reversible, report back on your findings? Clue: think about temperature or mixing	Use food to create a picture or representation of a wild animal you might find in the garden. Think about the shapes and colours of the food and how this could be used effectively.

Please complete the tasks in homework books. Every Friday we will look at work brought in so far and celebrate it! Also, if any work is not able to be stuck in, e.g. sculptures or 3D models, please take photos and send those in. Alternatively, email the year group address and we can print them in school.
